Years 1 and 2

Monday 8th June

(Claude Monet)



Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/#>) Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs

Writing: Research who Claude Monet was. Then looking at the water lilies paintings imagine you have been transported into the picture. Using your senses describe what you have seen, heard and touched. E.g I have seen a colourful butterfly fluttering by. I have touched the icy cool water. I have heard the splashing of frogs jumping into the water. This can be done verbally or written.

Maths: What are 3D shapes? Show <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zjv39j6/articles/zcstqy> Take children on a 3D shape hunt around your house or garden. Create a poster of the features of 3D shapes e.g faces, vertices, edges.

Topic: Using Claude Monet Water Lilies paintings taking a paper plate and using cupcake liners. Paint a paper plate blue/green, make lily pads from cupcake liners.

Tuesday 9th June

(Gustav Klimt)



Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/#>) Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs

Writing: Research who Gustav Klimt was. What country did he come from? Find out facts about Austria. Locate Austria on a map. Find the Austrian flag. Create a poster about Austria. What language do they speak. What sports are they known for? What language do they speak? Etc

Maths: Using a net of a cube. Make your own cube. Count how many vertices, edges and sides there are. <https://www.math-salamanders.com/3d-geometric-shapes.html>

Topic: Children can look closely at some of his patterns and replicate the patterns in their own style. They can use paint, or crayons or coloured pencils.

<p>Wednesday 10th June (Kandinsky)</p> 	<p>Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/#) Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs</p> <p>Writing: Research who Kandinsky was. Everything starts with a dot. Explain he created abstract art where there is no theme. Children create their own art using lines and circles. They can use black pen to make them stand out and then add lots of bright colours in the circles. Play music while the children do this. Then ask the children to write or explain how their art piece makes them feel.</p> <p>Maths: Use playdough to make 3D shapes e.g roll playdough into a ball to create a sphere, or a traffic cone to make a cone. Etc Here is a recipe if you don't have any play dough. https://www.diynatural.com/homemade-playdough-recipe/</p> <p>Topic: Kandinsky used circles and lines to create lots of his art. Children are to create different sized circles to be placed on top of each other within a 4inch square. Please could you send your child's square of circles into school. We will then put them together to make a whole class piece. I will display it in the classroom.</p>
<p>Thursday 11th June (Vincent Van Gogh)</p> 	<p>Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/#) Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs</p> <p>Writing: Research Vincent. Play the song starry starry night. Children create their own fact files about vincent. They can draw and write in their files.</p> <p>Maths: Using top marks website play 3D shape sorting games there is lots to choose from. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Search.aspx?q=3d%20shapes</p> <p>Topic:.. Look at the sunset on the fields and replicate this picture. You can use paint or crayons. The main colours are yellow, gold, white and blue. Create your own version.</p>
<p>Friday 12th June (Jackson Pollock)</p>	<p>Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/#) Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs</p> <p>Writing: Research Jackson Pollock. Show different art pieces and paintings. Ask the children do they think this is art or not? Explain that Jackson came from the USA, from the state of Wyoming. Find the state on a map. Can children write a travel brochure encouraging people to visit the USA. It can be A4 size. It can contain facts, pictures and drawings.</p> <p>Maths: Using lego, clixi, building blocks, card, create your own 3D world. It might be a magical castle or an alien planet etc What 3D shapes have you used? What 3D shape have you used the most?</p>



Topic: Jackson believed in action painting. Children can drip or splash paint on a large piece of paper.
