Reading: For reading this book, we will be using **Kensuke Kingdom**. You can either [read](#) or [listen](#) to it (you can download it for free). This book is about a boy called Michael, whose parents buy a 40-foot yacht to go sailing around the world after they lose their jobs at the construction site. One night Michael loses his balance and is thrown overboard. Read to or listen chapter 1- *Peggie Sue* and chapter 2- *Water, water everywhere*.

Task: Can you write a prediction about what might happen to Michael after he loses his balance and falls in the ocean?

Writing: Read or listen to chapter 1 of **Kensuke Kingdom**. How do you think Michael might be feeling about leaving behind his friends, family and school to go sailing around the world?

Task: Write a diary from Michael's point of view expressing your thoughts and feelings about leaving everything behind and going sailing around the world.

Maths: Spend some time on Times Table Rockstars - how many coins can you win today? Can you beat your records?

Think about what he looks like, include his age, what he was wearing and approximately whereabouts did he fall overboard. How do you think Stella Artois is feeling after realising what has happened? How do you think he's feeling having experienced all recent changes?
