
Monday 29th June



	<p><u>Posters</u> Can you think of a time you felt these? Tell someone in your family about it. Look in the mirror and make the expressions for yourself.</p> <p>Read the story the good samaritan or show the story https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MLzdQtetedc Compare the characters from the story and list their qualities. Ask what makes someone a good person. Ask children to explain which character was the nicest and why? Can you role play the story, either with your family, or perhaps retell it using some toys.</p>
<p>Tuesday 30th June</p> 	<p>Reading: Choose a favourite story to re-read or the school reading book you are on. (Remember Oxford Owl has all the banded books https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/find-a-book/library-page/# Also go to phonics play which is free as well to practice single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs</p> <p>Read the story 'Elmer' What made him different? Did it matter? What happened when he made himself "the same"? Why did the other elephants want to celebrate Elmer? Create your own Elmer - start with a blank outline, talk about what is special about your own?</p> <p>Watch the video 'celebration' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8Lu41LulQos Can you make up a dance / add your own instruments with your friends to join in with the celebration?</p> <p>https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-re-174-love-is-patient-bible-scripture-motivational-poster Show children the bible verse 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 Explore the idea that many things in life change over time, but love never changes. Children can write a poem of what love means to them. Love is Love is.... Explain that Jesus said the greatest commandment is to love thy neighbour as thyself.</p>
